Utility Rate Adjustment and Master Schedule of Fees Update

Recommendation from Administration

That Council approve a 15% increase to the current Wheatland County water and sewer utility rates effective January 1, 2021; and

Further, that Council approve the resulting necessary update to the water and sewer utility rates in the Master Schedule of Fees.

Chief Administrative Officer's Comments

Report

Division: County-wide

Council has a fiscal strategy to eventually achieve 100% cost recovery for water and sewer utility systems. Review of the 2019 budget revealed a combined annual deficit of approximately \$380,000 for water and sewer utilities throughout the County. A 15% increase, remaining consistent with the 15% increase adjustment that occurred between 2017 and 2018, is expected to result in an approximate combined increase in revenue of \$51,000. Between 2018 and 2020 there were no further rate increases.

The attached Schedule of Fees highlights the fees proposed to be updated and their resulting rates for 2021. The following table shows a comparison between the current rates and the proposed 2021 rates after a 15% increase.

Implications of Recommendation

General

The proposed increase will impact utility account holders, and therefore must be communicated effectively prior to proposed implementation on January 1, 2021. Administration will prepare a notice of the increase to be posted on our website and social media pages, and to be included as a mail-out to all utility account holders.

Organizational

The Master Schedule of Fees must be updated to reflect this change and posted for the January 1, 2021 effective date. Increased staff workload will be required to prepare communications and respond to the public inquiries.

Financial

An increase to revenue of the water and wastewater budgets that will close the \$380,000 gap between revenue and expenses by approximately \$51,000, based on 2019 consumption and utility account values.
